Neighborhood Notes & Reminders

Please bag, burn, or remove leaves from last fall. Not cleaning them up detracts from the beauty of our neighborhood. For Safety Reasons, PLEASE do not discard grass clippings from the lawn mower into the street. <u>This is dangerous for traffic and pedestrians</u>. Wet grass/leaves and wet asphalt pavements do not mix!

Burning: Is allowed every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday from 8:00am until dusk. Burning is NOT allowed on holidays. Leaves and yard waste ONLY. Garbage or anything that produces black smoke should not be allowed. To report someone in violation, contact Sangamon County Sheriff's Department (non-emergency), 217-753-6666. PLEASE NOTE: Branch pickup is the 3rd Monday every month.

Stickers for Leaf Pickup or excess refuse may be purchased at True Value on Stevenson Drive

Please refrain from parking your automobile in your front yard.

Trash Cans: On trash pick-up days, your trash cans should be moved home-side and off the street after your trash pickup.

Drainage Ditch Cleaning and Maintenance

Drainage issues cost heavily! Consider the labor, machinery, time and money spent for Woodside to clean out the drainage ditches. They clean it and residents fill it back up. Woodside did a lot of work on this project last year and will be cleaning them all out as an ongoing project. **PLEASE NOTE**: Per ILCS Sec. 605 5/9-118: ...Cuttings... Woodside Township can fine residents \$50-\$500.

Anyone who continues to disrupt the free flow of water in the ditches could be fined \$50-\$500 per occurrence by Woodside Township. Please do your part to keep the ditch on your property free of debris, lawn cuttings, and burn residue. If you put stuff in there, it is your responsibility to clean it out. Please clean out debris that you have allowed to accumulate in your ditch. After Woodside has completed the cleanout project, please keep these draining ditches open moving forward.
